MISSOULA-AREA RECREATION ENTHUSIASTS AND COMMUNITY LEADERS VOLUNTEER TO LEAD BITTERROOT RESORT STEERING COMMITTEE

MISSOULA – Community leaders representing recreation-based organizations and diverse businesses have volunteered to contribute to the conceptualization and development of the proposed Bitterroot Resort near Missoula.

The Bitterroot Resort team today announced the formation of its community-based advisory committee to help steer development of the proposed ski destination on the Maclay Ranch that seeks use of the National Forest lands of Carlton Ridge and Lolo Peak.

"It is crucial that our development team understand Bitterroot Valley priorities and work to incorporate the suggestions of our neighbors into our overall plan," said Jim Gill, Bitterroot Resort chief operating officer. "This committee will be a vital link, not only bringing those issues to the table, but also serving as ambassadors to share project plans with their communities. It is a pleasure working with such an enthusiastic and committed group." Gill brings more than three decades of valuable ski industry experience to the Bitterroot team; having previously served as General Manager at Breckenridge and Jackson Hole Mountain Resort.

The Bitterroot Resort Steering Committee is comprised of 33 Missoula-area recreation enthusiasts and community leaders. With the overall mission of assuring the social and political success of the project, committee members are serving on a volunteer basis to advise the resort team about community recreation priorities.

"Tourism plays a significant role in the health of the state economy, and this project has the potential to significantly impact the economic vitality of Western Montana," said Jay Robson, steering committee participant and member of the Montana Travel Advisory Council. "As community leaders, we should take the opportunity to engage with the resort team to help craft a resort for the benefit and enjoyment of all Bitterroot Valley residents."

Bitterroot Resort is a proposed all-season destination resort in Western Montana that would utilize land on the private Maclay Ranch and on the National Forest lands of Carlton Ridge and Lolo Peak, adjacent to the Selway/Bitterroot wilderness. With the greatest vertical descent in North America, Bitterroot Resort proposes a world-class alpine, snowboard and cross-country ski venue complete with a four-season resort village and residential community.
